## Description



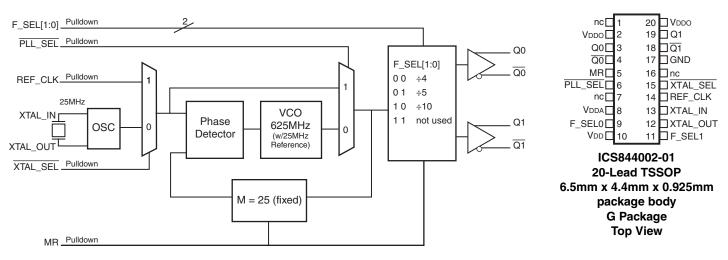
The ICS844002-01 is a 2 output LVDS Synthesizer optimized to generate Ethernet reference clock frequencies and is a member of the HiPerClocks<sup>TM</sup> family of high performance clock solutions from IDT. Using a 25MHz, 18pF parallel resonant crystal, the

following frequencies can be generated based on the 2 frequency select pins (F\_SEL[1:0]): 156.25MHz, 125MHz and 62.5MHz. The ICS844002-01 uses IDT's 3<sup>rd</sup> generation low phase noise VCO technology and can achieve <1ps typical rms phase jitter, easily meeting Ethernet jitter requirements. The ICS844002-01 is packaged in a small 20-pin TSSOP package.

## **Features**

- Two differential LVDS outputs
- Selectable crystal oscillator interface or single-ended LVCMOS/LVTTL input
- Supports the following output frequencies: 156.25MHz, 125MHz, 62.5MHz
- VCO range: 560MHz 680MHz

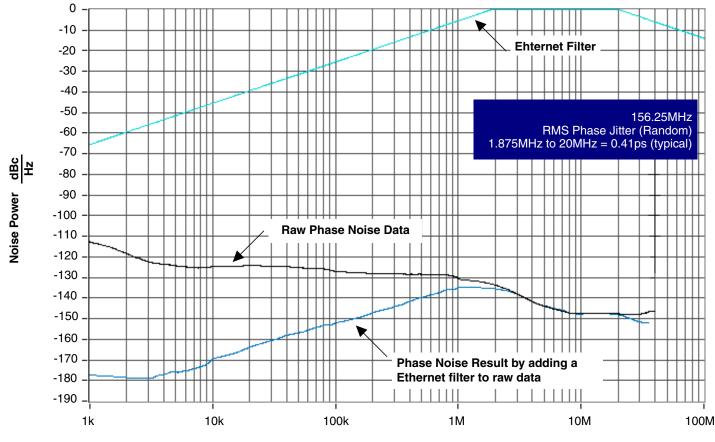

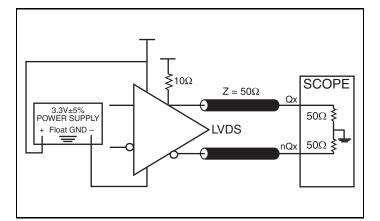

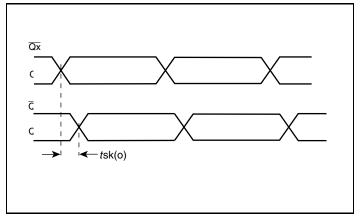
## **Typical Phase Noise at 156.25MHz**

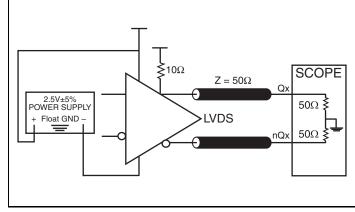

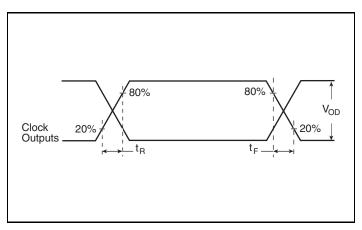


3.3V Output Load AC Test Circuit

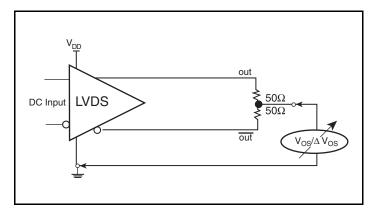




2.5V Output Load AC Test Circuit

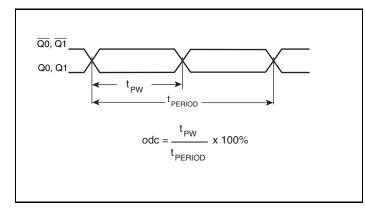


**Output Rise/Fall Time** 



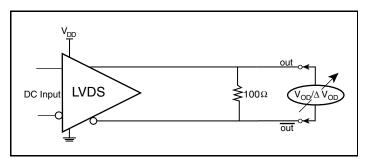

## **Application Information**

#### **Power Supply Filtering Technique**

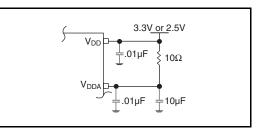


Figure 1. Power Supply Filtering

As in any high speed analog circuitry, the power supply pins are vulnerable to random noise. The ICS844002-01 provides separate power supplies to isolate any high switching noise from the outputs to the internal PLL.  $V_{DD}$ ,  $V_{DDA}$  and  $V_{DDO}$  should be individually connected to the power supply plane through vias, and bypass capacitors should be used for each pin. To achieve optimum jitter performance, power supply isolation is required. *Figure 1* illustrates how a  $10\Omega$  resistor along with a  $10\mu$ F and a  $0.01\mu$ F bypass capacitor should be connected to each  $V_{DDA}$  pin.

#### **Recommendations for Unused Input and Output Pins**

#### Inputs:

#### **LVCMOS Control Pins**

All control pins have internal pull-ups or pull-downs; additional resistance is not required but can be added for additional protection. A  $1k\Omega$  resistor can be used.

#### **REF\_CLK** INPUT

For applications not requiring the use of the reference clock, it can be left floating. Though not required, but for additional protection, a  $1k\Omega$  resistor can be tied from the REF\_CLK to ground.

#### **Crystal Inputs**

For applications not requiring the use of the crystal oscillator input, both XTAL\_IN and XTAL\_OUT can be left floating. Though not required, but for additional protection, a  $1k\Omega$  resistor can be tied from XTAL\_IN to ground.

#### Outputs:

#### **LVDS Outputs**

All unused LVDS output pairs can be either left floating or terminated with  $100\Omega$  across. If they are left floating, we recommend that there is no trace attached.

#### **Crystal Input Interface**

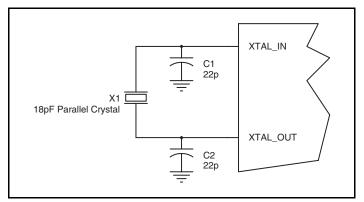


Figure 2. Crystal Input Interface

The ICS844002-01 has been characterized with 18pF parallel resonant crystals. The capacitor values shown in *Figure 2* below

#### LVCMOS to XTAL Interface

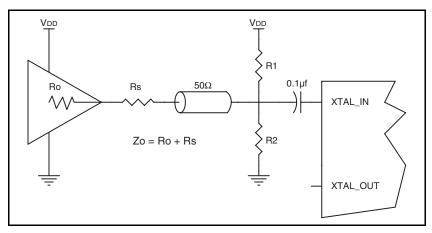


Figure 3. General Diagram for LVCMOS Driver to XTAL Input Interface

The XTAL\_IN input can accept a single-ended LVCMOS signal through an AC coupling capacitor. A general interface diagram is shown in *Figure 3*. The XTAL\_OUT pin can be left floating. The input edge rate can be as slow as 10ns. For LVCMOS inputs, it is recommended that the amplitude be reduced from full swing to half swing in order to prevent signal interference with the power rail and to reduce noise. This configuration requires that the output

impedance of the driver (Ro) plus the series resistance (Rs) equals the transmission line impedance. In addition, matched termination at the crystal input will attenuate the signal in half. This can be done in one of two ways. First, R1 and R2 in parallel should equal the transmission line impedance. For most  $50\Omega$  applications, R1 and R2 can be  $100\Omega$ . This can also be accomplished by removing R1 and making R2  $50\Omega$ .

were determined using a 25MHz, 18pF parallel resonant crystal and were chosen to minimize the ppm error.

#### 3.3V, 2.5V LVDS Driver Termination

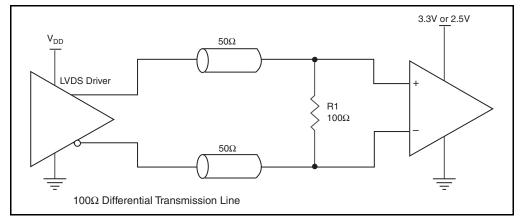


Figure 4. Typical LVDS Driver Termination

A general LVDS interface is shown in *Figure 4.* In a 100 $\Omega$  differential transmission line environment, LVDS drivers require a matched load termination of 100 $\Omega$  across near the receiver input.

For a multiple LVDS outputs buffer, if only partial outputs are used, it is recommended to terminate the unused outputs.

## **Power Considerations**

This section provides information on power dissipation and junction temperature for the ICS844002-01. Equations and example calculations are also provided.

#### 1. Power Dissipation.

The total power dissipation for the ICS44002-01 is the sum of the core power plus the analog power plus the power dissipated in the load(s). The following is the power dissipation for  $V_{DD} = 3.3V + 5\% = 3.465V$ , which gives worst case results.

NOTE: Please refer to Section 3 for details on calculating power dissipated in the load.

- Power (core)<sub>MAX</sub> = V<sub>DD MAX</sub> \* (I<sub>DD MAX</sub> + I<sub>DDA MAX</sub>) = 3.465V \* (105mA + 13mA) = 408.87mW
- Power (outputs)<sub>MAX</sub> = V<sub>DDO MAX</sub> \* I<sub>DDO MAX</sub> = 3.465V \* 110mA = 381.15mW

Total Power\_MAX = 381.15mW + 408.87mW = 790.02mW

#### 2. Junction Temperature.

Junction temperature, Tj, is the temperature at the junction of the bond wire and bond pad and directly affects the reliability of the device. The maximum recommended junction temperature for HiPerClockS devices is 125°C.

The equation for Tj is as follows: Tj =  $\theta_{JA}$  \* Pd\_total + T<sub>A</sub>

Tj = Junction Temperature

 $\theta_{JA}$  = Junction-to-Ambient Thermal Resistance

Pd\_total = Total Device Power Dissipation (example calculation is in section 1 above)

T<sub>A</sub> = Ambient Temperature

In order to calculate junction temperature, the appropriate junction-to-ambient thermal resistance  $\theta_{JA}$  must be used. Assuming a moderate air flow of 200 linear feet per minute and a multi-layer board, the appropriate value is 66.6°C/W per Table 6 below.

Therefore, Tj for an ambient temperature of 70°C with all outputs switching is:

70°C + 0.790W \* 66.6°C/W = 123°C. This is below the limit of 125°C.

This calculation is only an example. Tj will obviously vary depending on the number of loaded outputs, supply voltage, air flow and the type of board (single layer or multi-layer).

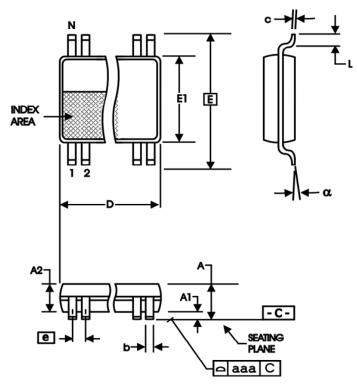
