

The planar structure and the platinum doped life time control, guarantee the best overall performance, ruggedness and reliability characteristics.

These devices are intended for use in the output rectification stage of SMPS, UPS, dc-to-dc converters as well as freewheeling diode in low voltage inverters and chopper motor drives.

Their extremely optimized stored charge and low recovery current minimize the switching losses and reduce over dissipation in the switching element and snubbers.

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


Fig. 1 - Typical Forward Voltage Drop Characteristics




Fig. 2 - Typical Values of Reverse Current vs. Reverse Voltage




Fig. 3 - Typical Junction Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage




Fig. 4 - Maximum Thermal Impedance Z_{thJC} Characteristics

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


Fig. 5 - Maximum Allowable Case Temperature vs.
Average Forward Current




Fig. 7 - Typical Reverse Recovery Time vs. dI_{F}/dt




Fig. 6 - Forward Power Loss Characteristics




Fig. 8 - Typical Stored Charge vs. dI_F/dt

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



Fig. 9 - Reverse Recovery Parameter Test Circuit



- (1) dI_F/dt rate of change of current through zero crossing
- (2) I_{RRM} peak reverse recovery current
- (3) $t_{\rm rr}$ reverse recovery time measured from zero crossing point of negative going $I_{\rm F}$ to point where a line passing through 0.75 $I_{\rm RRM}$ and 0.50 $I_{\rm RRM}$ extrapolated to zero current.
- (4) \mathbf{Q}_{rr} area under curve defined by \mathbf{t}_{rr} and \mathbf{I}_{RRM}

$$Q_{rr} = \frac{t_{rr} \times I_{RRM}}{2}$$

(5) $dI_{(rec)M}/dt$ - peak rate of change of current during t_b portion of t_{rr}

Fig. 10 - Reverse Recovery Waveform and Definitions


