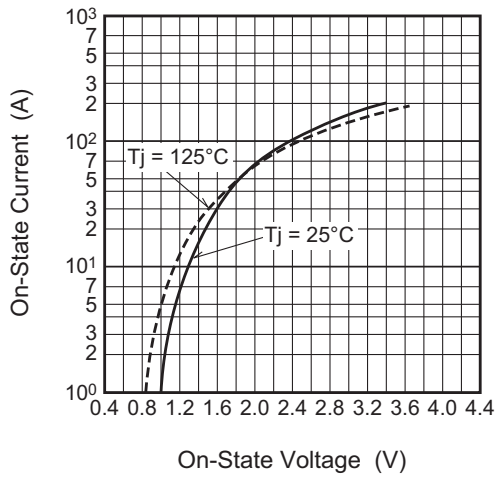

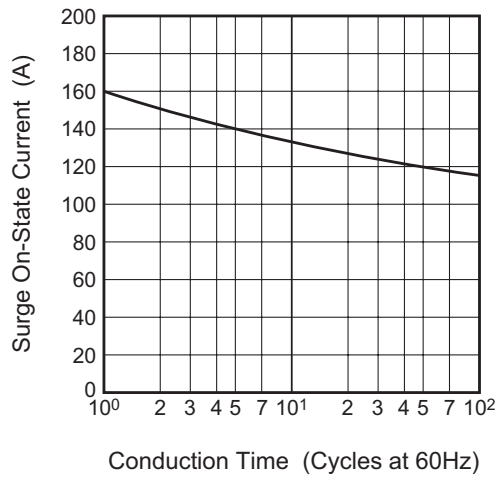

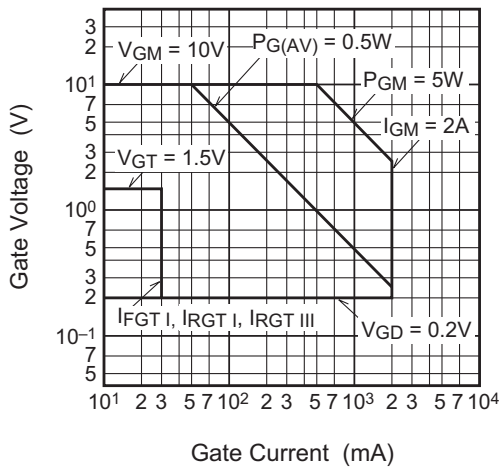
Maximum On-State Characteristics



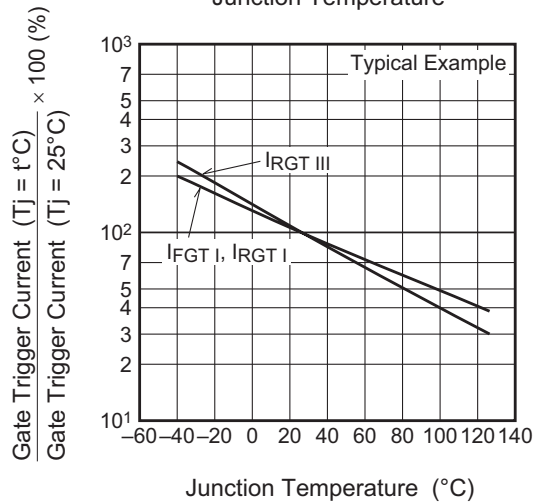
Rated Surge On-State Current



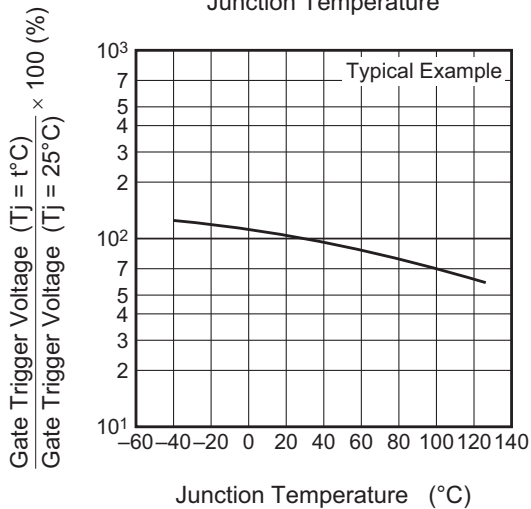
Gate Characteristics (I, II and III)



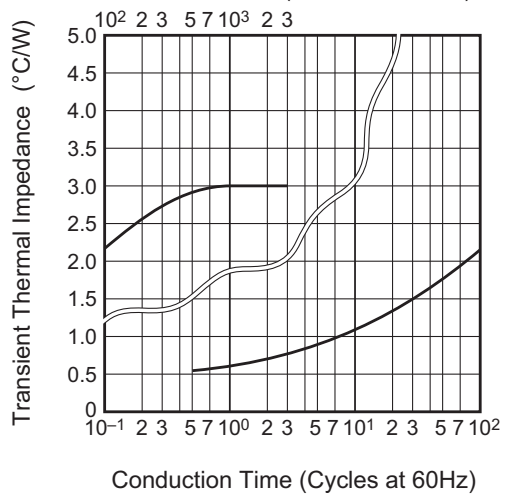
Gate Trigger Current vs. Junction Temperature



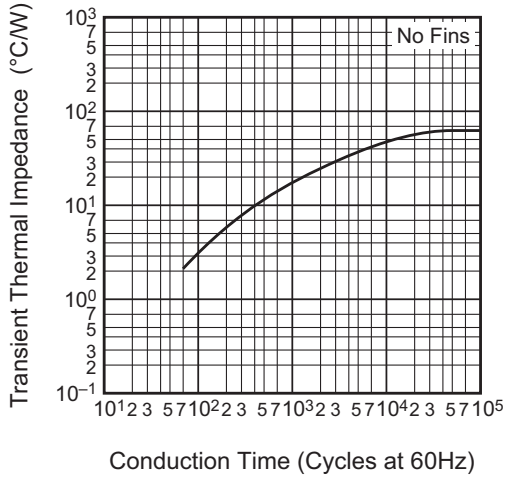
Gate Trigger Voltage vs. Junction Temperature



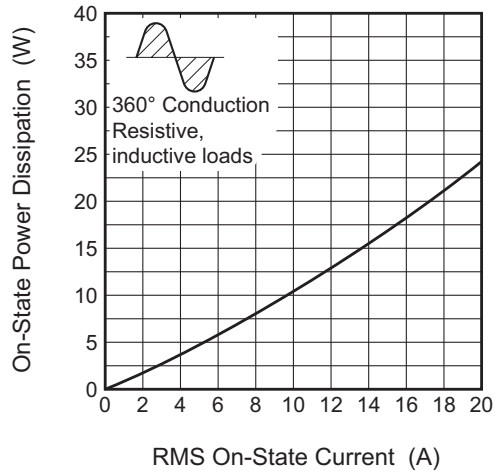
Maximum Transient Thermal Impedance Characteristics (Junction to case)



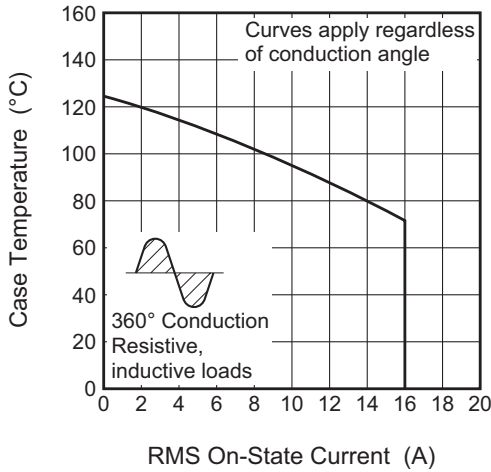
Maximum Transient Thermal Impedance Characteristics (Junction to ambient)



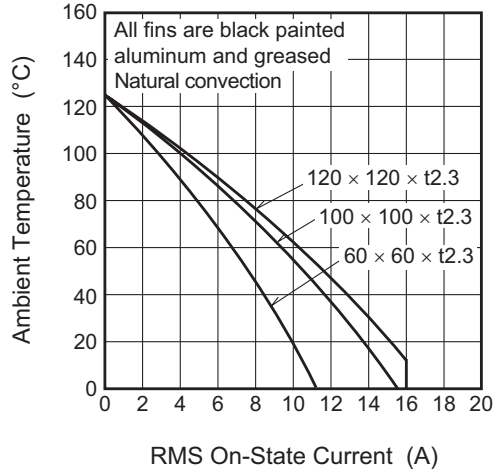
Maximum On-State Power Dissipation



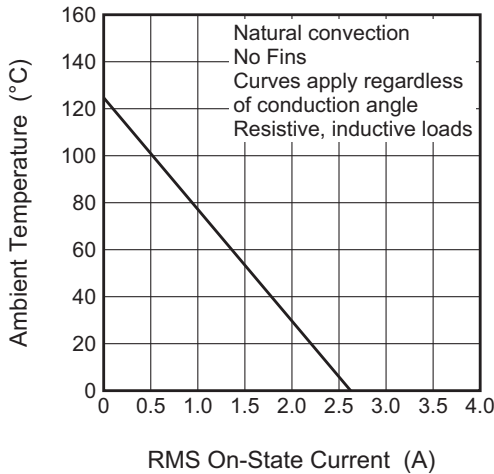
Allowable Case Temperature vs. RMS On-State Current



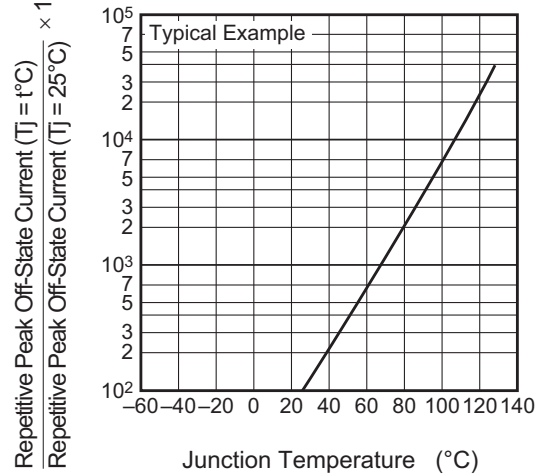
Allowable Ambient Temperature vs. RMS On-State Current



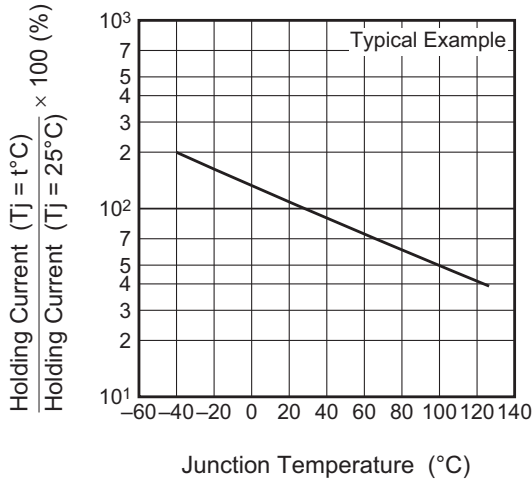
Allowable Ambient Temperature vs. RMS On-State Current



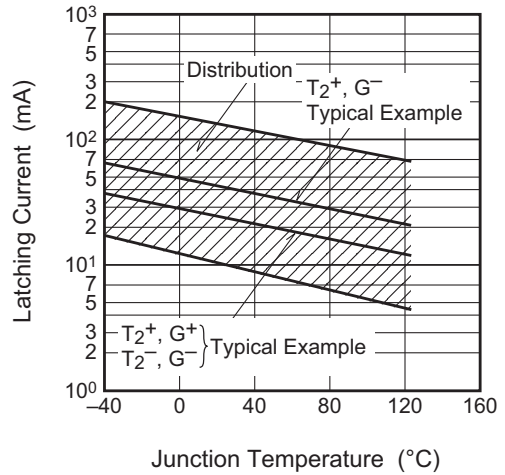
Repetitive Peak Off-State Current vs. Junction Temperature



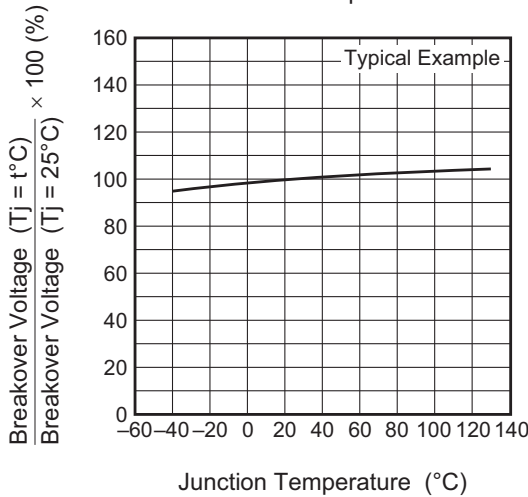
Holding Current vs. Junction Temperature



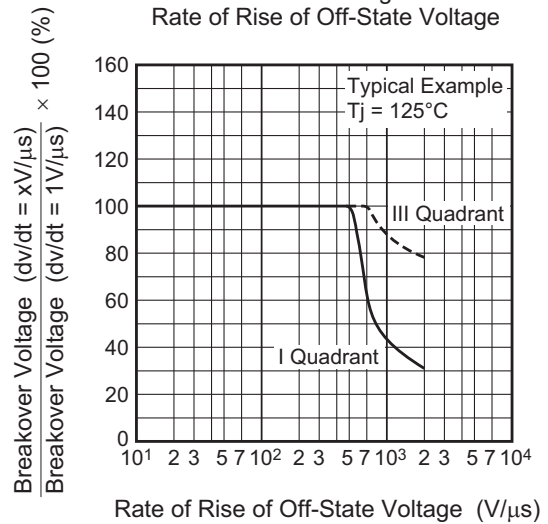
Latching Current vs. Junction Temperature



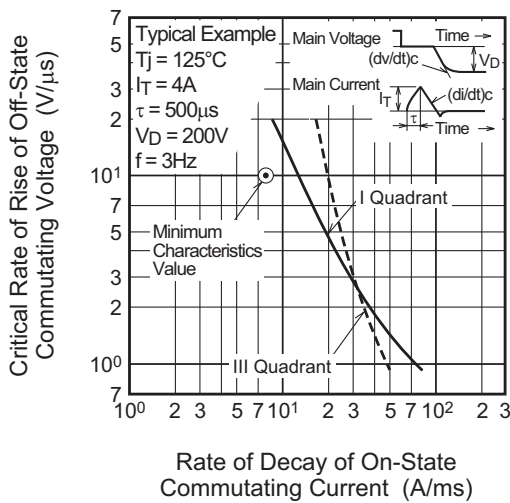
Breakover Voltage vs. Junction Temperature



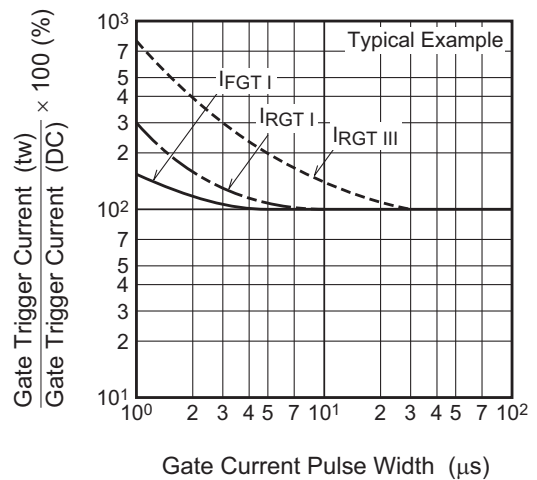
Breakover Voltage vs. Rate of Rise of Off-State Voltage



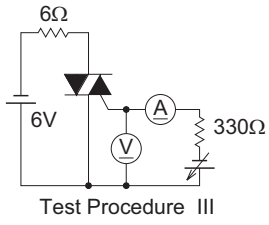
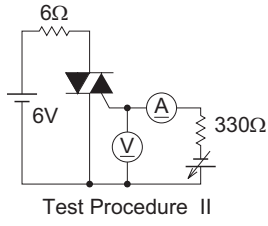
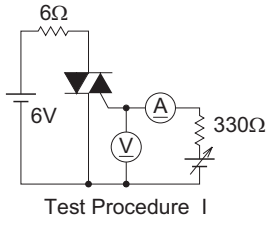
