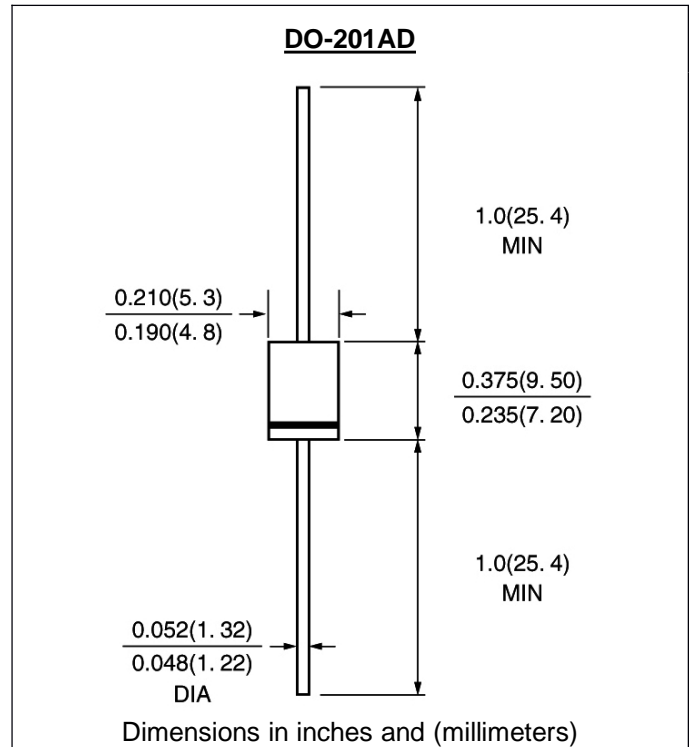

Figure 1. Max. Thermal Resistance vs. Lead Length

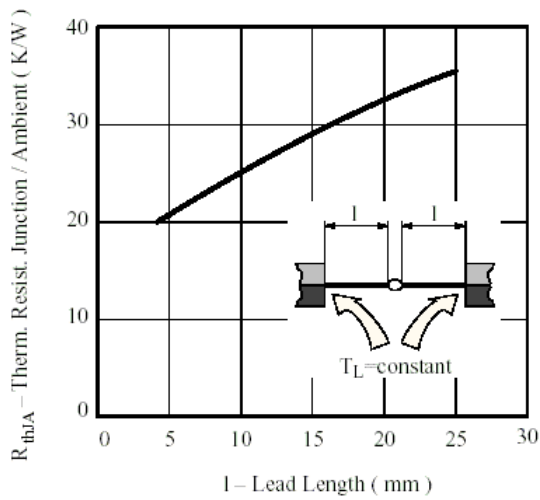


Figure 2. Reverse Current vs. Junction Temperature

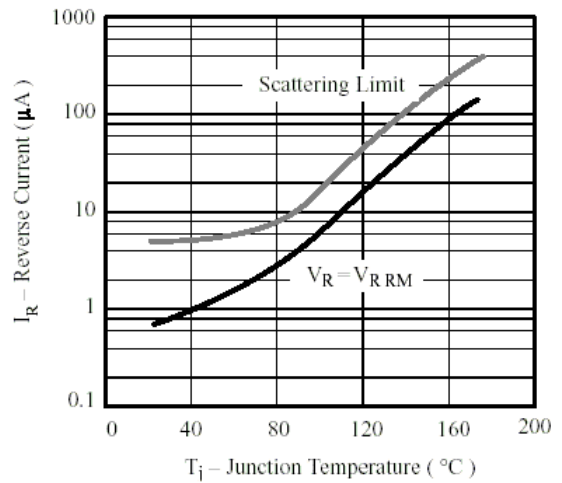


Figure 3. Max. Average Forward Current vs. Ambient Temperature

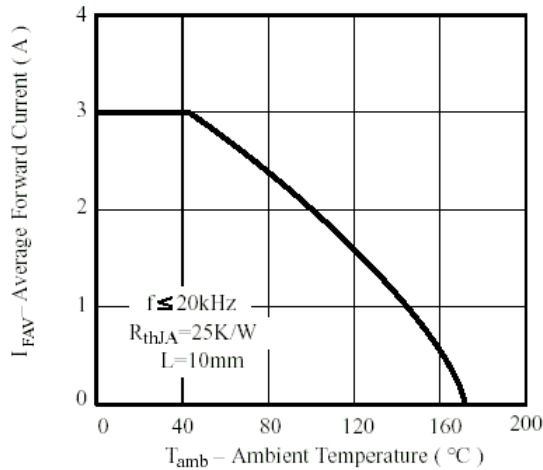


Figure 4. Max. Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage

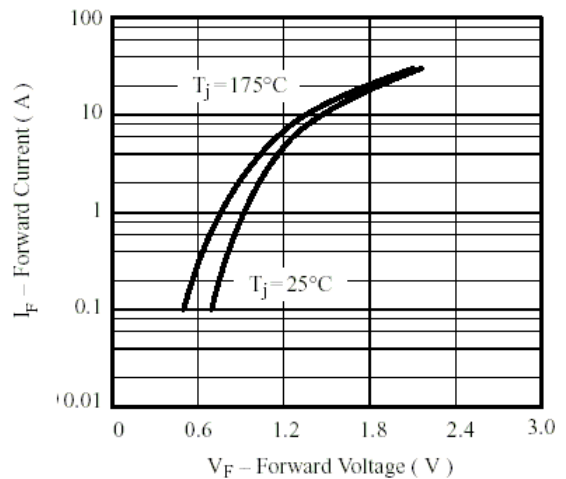


Figure 5. Typ. Diode Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage
