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INTRODUCTION

Product Overview The IE-78K0-NS-P01 is designed to be used with an in-circuit emulator (IE-78K0-NS or IE-78K0-NS-A) and emulation board (IE-780×××-NS-EM4) to debug 78K/0 Series 8-bit single-chip microcontrollers.

Target ReadersThis manual is intended for engineers who will use an in-circuit emulator (IE-78K0-NS or
IE-78K0-NS-A) and emulation board (IE-780×××-NS-EM4) with the IE-78K0-NS-P01 to
perform system debugging.

Engineers who use this manual are expected to be thoroughly familiar with the target device's functions and usage methods and to be knowledgeable about debugging.

Organization When using the IE-78K0-NS-P01, refer to not only this manual (supplied with the IE-78K0-NS-P01) but also the manuals that are supplied with the in-circuit emulator (IE-78K0-NS or IE-78K0-NS-A) and the emulation board (IE-780×××-NS-EM4).

The IE-78K0-NS used in combination with the IE-78K0-NS-PA is functionally equivalent to the IE-78K0-NS-A. Therefore, as necessary, read IE-78K0-NS + IE-78K0-NS-PA for IE-78K0-NS-A in this document.

Purpose

This manual's purpose is to explain various debugging functions that can be performed when using the IE-78K0-NS-P01.

Terminology

The meanings of certain terms used in this manual are listed below.

Term	Meaning		
Target device	This is the device that is the target for emulation.		
Target system	This includes the target program and the hardware provided by the user. When defined narrowly, it includes only the hardware.		
IE system	This refers to the combination of an in-circuit emulator (IE-78K0-NS or IE-78K0-NS-A), I/O board (IE-78K0-NS-P01), and emulation board (IE-780×××-NS-EM4).

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
CHAPTER 1 GENERAL

The IE-78K0-NS-P01 is a development tool for efficient debugging of hardware or software when using a 78K/0 Series 8-bit single-chip microcontroller.

This chapter describes the IE-78K0-NS-P01 system configuration and hardware configuration.

1.1 System Configuration

Figure 1-1 illustrates the IE-78K0-NS-P01 system configuration.



Note For the device file, emulation probe, and conversion socket/conversion adapter, refer to the user's manual that comes with the IE-780×××-NS-EM4.

1.2 Hardware Configuration





Figure 1-2. Basic Hardware Configuration (Using IE-78K0-NS)

Figures 1-2 and 1-3 show the IE-78K0-NS-P01's position in the basic hardware configuration.

2.1 Parts of Main Unit




Figure 2-1. Side Connected to IE-780xxx-NS-EM4

CHAPTER 3 INSTALLATION

This chapter describes methods for connecting the IE-78K0-NS-P01 to the in-circuit emulator (IE-78K0-NS or IE-78K0-NS-A), emulation probe, etc. Mode setting methods are also described.

Caution Connecting or removing components to or from the target system, or making switch or other setting changes must be carried out after the power supply to both the IE system and the target system has been switched OFF.

3.1 Connection

See the **IE-78K0-NS User's Manual (U13731E)** for a description of how to connect the IE-78K0-NS-P01 to the IE-78K0-NS and IE-780×××-NS-EM4.

See the **IE-78K0-NS-A User's Manual (U14889E)** for a description of how to connect the IE-78K0-NS-P01 to the IE-78K0-NS-A and IE-780×××-NS-EM4.

Caution Incorrect connection may damage the IE system.

Be sure to read the user's manual of each product for a detailed description of the connection method.

3.2 Clock Settings

The IE-78K0-NS-P01 includes the following oscillator and parts boards for the clock.

- (1) 8.388608 MHz (OSC1) (fixed mounting)
- (2) Parts board for clock (X1)
- (3) Parts board for clock (X2)

For the clock setting procedure of the IE-78K0-NS-P01, refer to the user's manual of the IE-78K0×××-NS-EM4 to be used. If no instructions regarding clock settings are provided in the user's manual of the IE-78K0×××-NS-EM4 to be used, clock setting is not necessary in the IE-78K0-NS-P01. Leave the parts boards for the clocks, X1 and X2, mounted in the IE-78K0-NS-P01 as they are.



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
