




Figure 1. Power Dissipation vs. Ambient Temperature




Figure 2. Forward Current vs. Ambient Temperature




Figure 3. Rel. Luminous Intensity vs. Angular Displacement




Figure 4. Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage

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


Figure 5. Relative Intensity vs. Wavelength




Figure 8. Forward Current vs. Pulse Length




Figure 6. Rel. Luminous Intensity vs. Ambient Temperature






Figure 7. Forward Voltage vs. Ambient Temperature



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PACKAGE DIMENSIONS in millimeters






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Mounting Pad Layout
